## **General Update**

And yet another busy term for the DLP ....

This term saw us meet with our Trust Board and our union colleagues. We discussed our budget for 2023-24, recent Ofsted Inspections and CPD that was currently being undertaken. The Board is made up of Heads, Chairs, LA reps and Trust Partners. We also meet with unions and professional associations representatives termly. It is always useful to hear external views on what the partnership is doing.

We have had three schools over this term publish the outcome of their recent Ofsted inspections. St Thomas', Leesfield, Delph and Diggle Primary Schools were all judged as good schools. Whilst it is a stressful time during the inspection, our schools felt they were well prepared through our Peer Reviews. All felt that overall the inspectors had been fair. We are delighted for our pupils, staff, governors and school communities that they received such positive outcomes from the inspections. The reports are available through the schools' websites.

Our CPD programme has continued with further behaviour training for staff to become trainers. We trained 10 people who are now deemed Classroom Culture Certified Instructors This means we have a specialists in each school and have a team we can call on to support across all schools.

We have also begun a bespoke 4 session event for subject coordinators to develop their skills and support the work they do across school.

Planning has also started for our annual staff event which is held in October each year. The focus for this will be SEND under the theme of 'everyone's responsibility'.

As well as all this several schools have participated in their Peer Reviews, we held our Spelling Bee (see below), networks have taken place and we have looked to further develop our Social Media presence.

Thanks to everyone for all your hard work supporting the DLP this academic year.

#### **DLP MUSIC FESTIVAL**

On Friday 14<sup>th</sup> July 2023 we held our first DLP Music Festival. Celebrating the talents and dedication of our pupils and music coordinators, Saddleworth School hosted the event - For the Children by the Children. Performances were filmed and will be shared with parents/carers and the individual schools. The morning featured an eclectic mix of music from brass bands, keyboards, choirs, piano, guitars and a Spice Girls tribute.

Compared by Mr Anderson, first up was Saddleworth Brass Band with a rousing performance of songs from West Side Story including Maria, Tonight and America. Followed by Delph Primary School Brass Band who gave us a hymn – They Shall Not Grow Old, popular songs Can You Feel The Love Tonight and A Whole New World finishing with Just Do It!





To complete our brass section we had two performances - F Sharp Jam Blues & Movie Buster from Christ Church Denshaw Year 4 Brass





Diggle Guitar Group were up next. The group are made up of pupils who have just started playing and those who have been playing for quite some time. They played a real mix of tunes including

The Banks of the Ohio, a bluesy tale of woe about hunger and eating a dog (!), Let it Go from Frozen and finally Pink Floyd's Another Brick in the Wall (the audience joined in with 'we don't need no education'). Please note the magnificent selection of hats worn.

After an interval where juice and delicious biscuits were on offer, we reconvened with Friezland Primary School's Keyboard Group. They played What Do We Do With the Drunken Sailor and Hallelujah.

Next up we welcomed the St Thomas', Leesfield Primary School Choir who sang two Elton John songs Can You Feel the Love Tonight (with a fantastic piano accompaniment) and I'm Still Standing.







We finished the morning with a lively performance from St Agnes Primary School. Fresh from their school show we were treated to a song - and dance - Spice Up Your Life! What a great way to end the Festival
